Stanley comes home from the auto shop and tells Stella that he has learned about Blanche's past: she had a reputation for being a loose woman in Laurel, and she was fired for having an affair with one of her students. He has informed Mitch and also purchased Blanche a birthday present: a one-way bus ticket back to Laurel.
